Requirements:

Associate of Science

- Two years/ 60 credits
- 15 to 18 General Education credits only
- Courses leading to licensing or job preparation
- Elective courses

Associate of Arts

- Two years/60 credits
- First two years of Bachelor's degree
- 39 to 45 credits in General Education courses

Bachelor Degree

- 4 years/ 120 credits
- Includes all the General Education requirements
- Completion of a Major field of studies
- Minor field of studies
- Elective courses

Master's Degree

Graduate Degree

- After completion of Bachelor's degree.
- Approximately from 30 to 60 credits depending on the field.
- Some programs require a passing score on the GRE (Graduate Record Examination).
- Specialized professional degree.

Doctorate Degree

Graduate degree

- After completion of the Master's degree
- Amount of credits varies according to field of studies
- Specialized professional degree
- Highest level
- Doctor in Philosophy (Ph.D.)

- Community College
- College or University
- Vocational or Career College
- Accreditation

- High School diploma
- Official high school transcripts.
- SAT/ACT Scores or Placement/Diagnostic Test.
- Advanced Placement Courses' original transcripts
- Dual Enrollment courses' transcripts
